In honor of the 150th anniversary of the death of St. John Vianney, Pope Benedict XVI inaugurated a special "Year for Priests." The Holy Father's primary intention is to deepen the commitment of all priests to the interior renewal for the sake of a more forceful and incisive witness to the Gospel in today's world. It is also intended to encourage all the faithful to pray for their priests, and to beg the Lord of the Harvest for more priestly vocations.



This year's IRL National Meeting will highlight the priestly life and ministry of Rev. John A. Hardon, S.J. The principal founder of the INSTITUTE ON RELIGIOUS LIFE in 1974, this saintly Jesuit spent much time and energy working for the authentic renewal of the consecrated life, catechetics, Catholic family life, pro-life efforts and Marian devotion. He passed away on December 30, 2000, and his cause for canonization has been officially opened.



Teens and young adults (ages 13-30) are invited to attend Saturday's general session free of charge. In the morning, they will join all participants in the general session, and in the afternoon they will be able to choose from a variety of inspiring and informative workshops.
