A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

As I write this article it is Friday, January 16th... two days before the Chicago Bears big game against the Los Angeles Rams, and six days after their miraculous victory against the Green Bay Packers in the first round of the playoffs. Whether the Bears win or lose on Sunday, this season has been an entertaining one to say the least, and way better than anyone would have predicted last summer.

Why would I be writing about a sports team in my weekly bulletin article? As big a fan as I am of the Chicago Cubs and Bears, I very rarely ever talk about them in the context of faith, and even when people ask me to pray for a sports team victory, I always politely try to tell them that God has more important things to attend to.

One of the dynamics of this Bears season, however, has been a focus on the longtime owner of the Bears, Virginia McCaskey, daughter of one of the founders of the NFL, George Halas, and a Catholic woman of great faith, who passed away last January at the age of 102.

Deacon Jim Devine shared with me an article on January 14th from the Daily Herald authored by long-time sports writer Dan Pompei titled, "This magical Bears season is beyond explanation. Is it divine intervention?" Mr. Pompei writes:

A patch with the letters VMH has brightened the jersey of every Chicago Bears player this season. It sits as close to their hearts as the numbers will allow. The patches are a tribute to Virginia Halas McCaskey, the matriarch of the team, whose one-year death anniversary falls two days before Super Bowl LX. They are as good an explanation as any for how this team keeps winning games that have been described as miraculous.

This Bears season, maybe more than any of the 105 that preceded it, has been about faith. These Bears apparently play with an absence of doubt, and their superpower is the ability to have conviction without proof...

McCaskey sat in the same pew for 6:15 Mass every morning. She wore away the orange and blue colors on the beads of her rosary. No one had a deeper appreciation and understanding of the Bears. She experienced more of the Bears' history than anyone, including her father, and once called the team "her life..."

Thirty-three years later [after the Bears won Super Bowl XX in 1986], McCaskey had a chapel built at Halas Hall where players and employees can throw up Hail Marys. After her death, the chapel was dedicated to her. The plaque outside the chapel calls her "A WOMAN OF STEADFAST FAITH."

And if the chapel was not busy before games this season, it should have been after.

I had the privilege of meeting Virginia McCaskey several times during my years here at St. Theresa and even had the honor of attending a game in one of her five skyboxes at Soldier Field (noteworthy in that she had no alcohol in any of her skyboxes). She was always kind, friendly and had an exceptional memory! She was also never bashful talking about her Catholic faith.

She was indeed a devoted and unapologetic Catholic who brought so much of her faith to the administration of the team. She even disbanded the Honey Bears Cheerleading squad after the Super Bowl win in 1986 because she found the idea of cheerleading a professional football team "embarrassing, sexist, and degrading to women." Despite their undeserved reputation as being "cheap," both Virginia and her father contributed millions of dollars to charitable causes and helped countless players financially through the years when they were going through difficult personal challenges.

In a sports and entertainment world that abhors talking about faith in fear of offending people who don't share a particular faith expression, Virginia McCaskey stood out as someone who was proudly and unequivocally Catholic.

Win or lose against the Rams, I will still say that God is too busy to be concerned with the vagrancies of intervening in sporting events, but maybe, just maybe, Mrs. McCaskey is looking down on the Bears this season and inspiring them to miraculous finishes?



GOOD NEWS TO SHARE

As a result of a payroll tax credit, St Theresa Parish and School is the beneficiary of a one-time refund in the amount of \$99,943. A suggestion was made by the Finance Council to use that tax credit to establish a tuition assistance endowment fund for future needs of St Theresa School students.

To this end, in December we offered “a dollar for dollar matching” contribution for tuition assistance for Giving Tuesday and for the end of the 2025 tax year. Our parishioners stepped up and contributed \$19,700 from those two efforts. These donations will be used for assistance for the next academic year.

Due to this generosity, we've earmarked matching dollars, also in the amount of \$19,700, as seed money for a new endowment fund for future years.

We were very encouraged by December's efforts and because this success, beginning Catholic Schools Week, January 25 through the end of the school year, we are offering to continue the program. Remember our need is twofold. Your donations will be used for 2026-2027 school year assistance for needy families; and the matching dollars from the tax credit will be invested in this endowment fund for future use. Please help us reach the remaining goal of an additional \$80,000 for next year's financial assistance and then the matching tax credit proceeds will be used to enrich the endowment fund.
