A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

As we continue the celebration of Easter, I share with you yet another gem from my daily reflection book from Pope Benedict. It addresses something very significant in this world which has become more and more secularized by the day. If we don't believe in Christ, if we don't believe he rose from the dead, what would the consequences of such belief really be? The Holy Father says the following:

What would it mean if Easter, the Resurrection of Jesus, had not taken place?..

Well, if there were no Resurrection, the story of Jesus would have ended with Good Friday. His body would have decayed, and he would have become a has-been. But that would mean that God does not take initiatives in history, that he is either unable or unwilling to touch this world of ours, our human living and dying. And that in turn would mean that love is futile, nugatory [inconsequential], an empty and vain promise. It would mean that there is no judgment and no justice. It would mean that the moment is all that counts and that right belongs to the cunning, the crafty and those without consciences. There would be no judgment. Many people, and by no means only wicked people, would welcome that because they confuse judgment with petty calculation and give more room to fear than to a trusting love... All this makes clear what Easter does mean: God has acted. History does not go on aimlessly. Justice, love, truth - these are realities, genuine reality. God loves us; he comes to meet us. The more we go along his path and live in his way, the less we need to fear justice and truth, the more our hearts will be full of Easter joy. Easter is not only a story to be told: it is a signpost on life's way. It is not an account of a miracle that happened a very long time ago: it is the breakthrough which has determined the meaning of all history. If we grasp this, we too, today, can utter the Easter greeting with undiminished joy: Christ is risen; yes, he is risen indeed!

Here are the implications if there is no Resurrection: God is far off and uninterested in involving himself with his creatures. Love is meaningless because it doesn't overcome death or injustice. Justice ultimately is unnecessary and power is ceded to those who have no conscience, and they become the arbiters of truth. Pope Benedict reveals that some might actually like this idea of a distant, uninvolved God because accountability is practically non-existent in such a scenario and life appears to be easier without it.

But for those of us with faith, then the Resurrection is a reminder of God's active role in his creation. We matter to God! Death does not have the final say, because the Incarnate God has intervened in human history and his sacrifice of love has redeemed us from our sin and opened for us the gates to paradise! Justice, love and truth are all centered in Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

The closer one is connected to Jesus in truth and love, the less one fears judgment. Why? Because judgment is no longer arbitrary... it is aligned with the truth of Christ. If we live in the truth of Christ, then judgment should be a source of joy not an opportunity for dread.

I can't imagine what it is like to live without hope in the Resurrection and its expression in joy. I invite you to pray for those who have abandoned their faith or struggle with it. And please, be an agent of Christ's Resurrection to all you meet. You have been given the gift of the Holy Spirit... allow it to catapult you into an evangelistic frenzy... sharing with others the Good News that led the apostles to the ends of the world as they knew it!

Christ is Risen! Alleluia!!

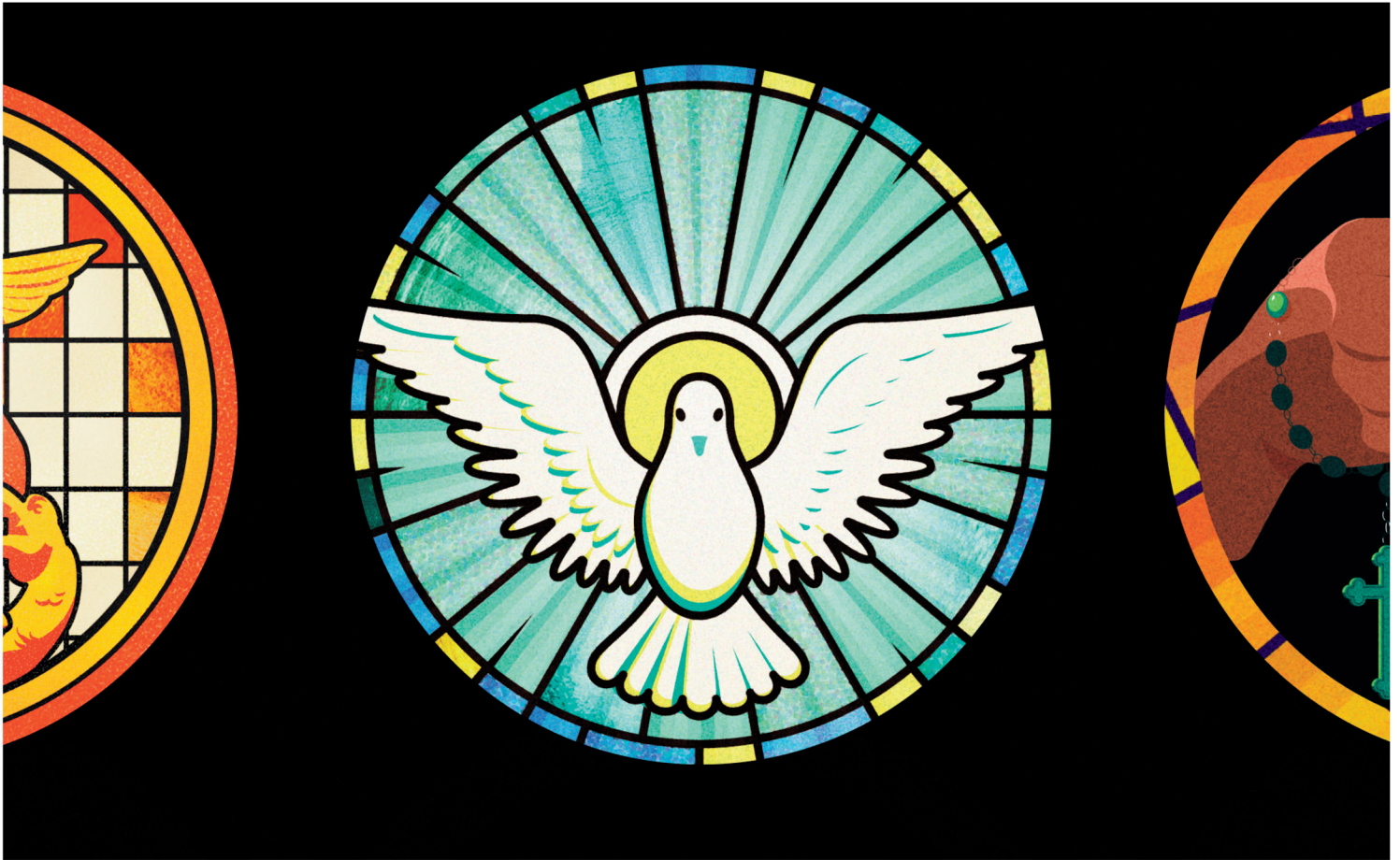

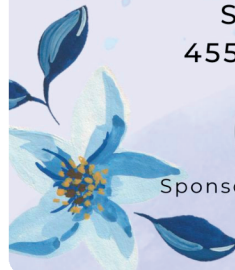

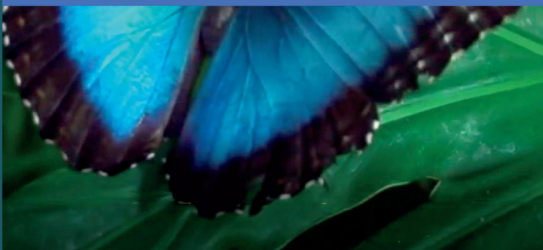
