# A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

As we progress through the Church's liturgical year, we often look forward to the great seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. These seasons are rich with special traditions, powerful symbols, and profound celebrations of the mysteries of our faith. Yet, 34 of the 52 weeks of the year is spent in a season known as Ordinary Time. While its name may suggest something unremarkable, Ordinary Time is anything but ordinary in our spiritual lives.

The word "ordinary" comes from the Latin word *ordo*, meaning "order" or "numbered." Ordinary Time refers to the weeks that are counted and ordered throughout the year. It is the season in which we focus on the public ministry of Jesus Christ and seek to grow as His disciples in the ordinary circumstances of daily life.

Ordinary Time teaches us a very valuable spiritual lesson... holiness is not reserved for extraordinary moments alone. Most of our lives are lived in the routine of work, family responsibilities, friendships, and daily obligations. It is precisely there that God calls us to follow Him. The saints remind us that holiness is often found not in dramatic acts, but in faithful living, quiet prayer, humble service, and acts of charity performed day after day.

During Ordinary Time, the Gospel readings guide us through Jesus' public ministry... His teachings, miracles, and encounters with others. Week after week, we learn what it means to love our neighbor, forgive our enemies, trust in God's providence, and live according to the example of Christ. These lessons gradually shape our hearts and transform our lives. Spiritual growth, much like the growth of a tree, usually occurs slowly rather than all at once.

The green vestments worn during Ordinary Time carry their own message. Green symbolizes life, growth, and hope. Just as plants need time, sunlight, and rain to flourish, our souls require regular prayer, participation in the sacraments, and attentiveness to God's Word. Ordinary Time encourages us to cultivate these habits so that our faith may mature and bear fruit.

In a culture that often seeks constant excitement and immediate results, Ordinary Time reminds us of the value of patience and consistency. God is present not only in extraordinary experiences but also in the ordinary moments of every day. A sincere prayer before work, a kind word to a neighbor, an act offered in love, and faithful attendance at Sunday Mass can become powerful expressions of discipleship.

As we continue through this season, let us embrace Ordinary Time as an opportunity to strengthen our faith rather than an insignificant amount of time between greater seasons. May we recognize that the Lord walks with us in the ordinary rhythms of life and uses them to draw us closer to Himself.

Let's pray that the Holy Spirit will help us grow in faith, hope, and charity, so that each day, however ordinary it may seem, becomes an offering of love to God.

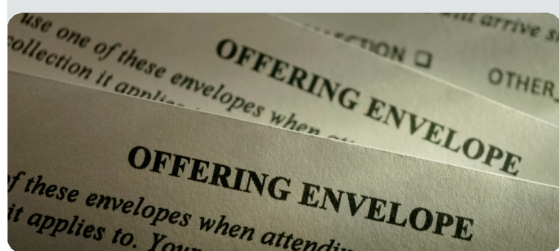

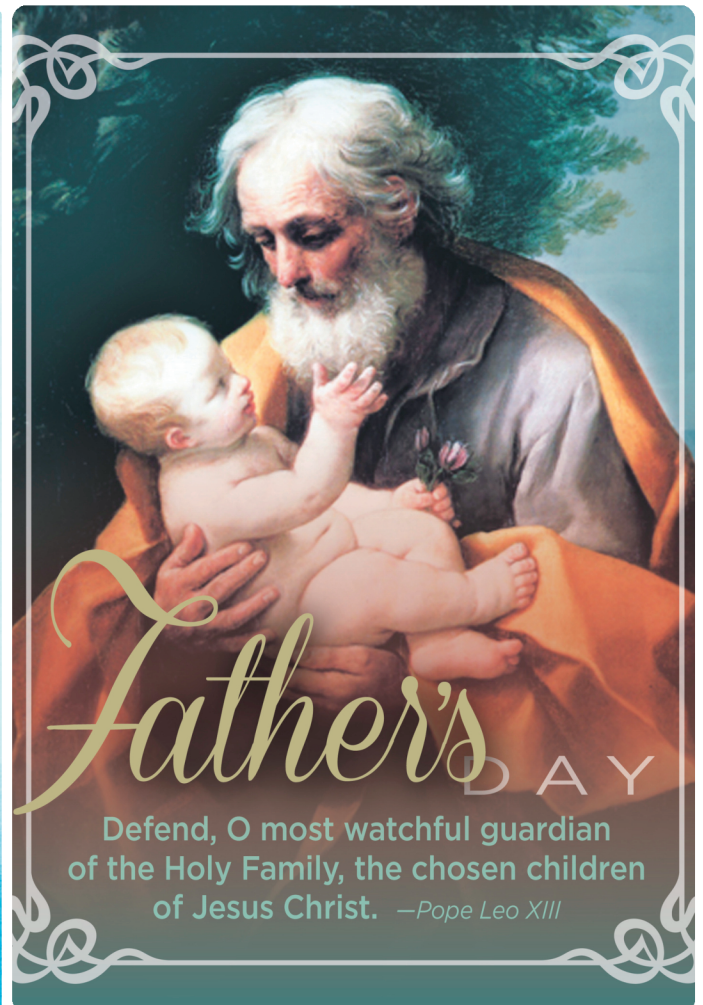

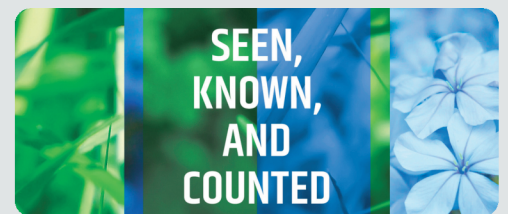

## GOSPEL MEDITATION

**June 21, 2026**  
**12th Sunday in Ordinary Time**  
**Matthew 10:26-33**



Jean Améry, a Holocaust survivor tortured by the Nazis, later wrote about the abyss of human evil. He described his reaction as an "indignant despair." Haven't we all, to some degree, felt that abyss opened beneath us? A sudden loss, a violent headline, a moment of loneliness or panic, when the world feels fragile and meaning seems to collapse?

It is to this fear that Jesus speaks in today's Gospel: "Do not be afraid of those who can kill the body." (Matthew 10:28) He does not deny evil or pretend we will never suffer. Instead, He reframes the abyss: do not fear those who can kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Your life is seen, known, and counted by the Father. Even the hairs of your head, even the sparrow's fall.

This is no superficial comfort. Jesus himself has entered the abyss: suffering, death, even our sense of forsakenness, and he has come through it. That is why his words, "Do not be afraid," hold such weight. They do not erase the abyss but build a bridge across it.

Faith is not pretending everything is fine. It is staring into the abyss and still choosing trust. And in that trust, we discover we are never alone. Christ stands with us, and the Father's care surrounds us. That is the only comfort deep enough for our (often fearful) hearts.
